



Garrett High School Career Development Program wins top honor at 2025 International Builders Show

In a packed exhibit hall at the International Builders Show, Garrett High School's Career Development Program (CDP) was announced as the firstplace winner of NAHB's 2025 Outstanding Student Chapter of the Year.



"Over \$8 million dollars in homes have been built by Garrett High School students, and 93 local families live in houses constructed through the program," the announcer said, in reference to the CDP's 50-year history in Garrett. The program was praised for its innovative curriculum, hands-on training, and strong industry partnerships. These elements have set a benchmark for excellence, equipping students with practical skills and knowledge needed to thrive in the ever-evolving construction sector.

CDP students benefit from the on-site experience they receive in the program, where they gain expertise in areas such as carpentry, project management, and sustainable building practices. The school implements a multi-age recruitment strategy, engaging students from elementary to high school, to build a strong pipeline for construction careers.

"This achievement reflects our continued commitment to excellence in education, preparing the next generation of innovators and leaders as we fulfill our mission to graduate responsible, productive citizens," said Garrett High School Principal Matt Smith.

According to NAHB, through 2026 it's estimated the construction industry will need over 2 million additional workers, and the Career Development Program graduates are poised to lead the charge, bringing innovation and expertise to the forefront of residential construction.


